As Battle of Britain Memorial volunteer George Taylor outlines in this fascinating talk, they took all forms, some cheery and bright and full of confidence, some upbeat, some sentimental, some deeply moving towards the end of the war and some downright daft.

This talk will take the audience through the war, noting the changes that occurred and playing the music that inspired a nation.

George Taylor, ex National Service RAF, has long enjoyed popular music of the 1930s and '40s. As always, he will be joined by Peter Clayton, whose career included operating sound equipment within the film industry, making him an idea person to 'twiddle the knobs' and provide the music.
